## **Moving Abroad Checklist**



## 6-12 Months Before Departure

☐ Check visa requirements and residency permits – Rules differ by country, and applications can take weeks or months. Start early to avoid delays.
☐ <b>Ensure your passport is valid</b> – Many countries won't grant entry if your passport is close to expiring. Renew in advance if needed.
☐ Research healthcare access and insurance – NHS cover won't apply abroad. Check local systems and arrange private insurance if required.
☐ <b>Look into the cost of living, local laws, and tax rules</b> – Build a realistic budget, understand legal restrictions, and know your tax obligations.
6–9 Months Before Departure
<ul> <li>Apply for your visa/permit – Bureaucracy can involve interviews, biometrics, and proof of funds. Begin the process early.</li> </ul>

□ Collect important documents – Gather originals like birth/marriage certificates, NI number, qualifications, and medical records. Certified translations may be necessary.
Make certified copies and digital backups – Keep secure copies online or on encrypted storage for emergencies.
3–6 Months Before Departure
☐ <b>Inform your bank of your move</b> – Prevent account freezes or blocked cards by letting your bank know.
☐ <b>Decide whether to keep a UK account open</b> – Useful for pensions, bills, or savings management.
☐ <b>Research international banking options</b> – Some banks operate in both the UK and abroad, easing the transition.
☐ <b>Submit a P85 form to HMRC</b> – Notifies HMRC of your move, adjusts tax obligations, and may secure refunds.
☐ Consider currency transfer services – Specialist providers often beat high bank fees and poor exchange rates.
Arrange accommodation abroad – Secure temporary or permanent housing before you arrive.

Confirm your employment contract or work arrangements – Get written confirmation of terms like salary, benefits, and start date.
Check if UK qualifications are recognised abroad – Professions like teaching, medicine, or law may need validation or conversion.
□ Book GP and dental check-ups – Easier to handle health needs before leaving the UK.
☐ <b>Request your NHS medical records</b> – Acts as your health passport abroad.
☐ Check vaccination requirements – Some destinations require proof of immunisations.
□ <b>Notify your child's school</b> – Request transfer records in advance.
Review pet export rules – Complete microchipping, vaccinations, and paperwork for travel.
2–3 Months Before Departure
Declutter and decide what to take, sell, or store – Reduces shipping costs and avoids clutter.
Pack essentials for the first few weeks – Clothing, toiletries, medication, chargers, and key documents.

Check airline baggage limits – Avoid extra charges by knowing the rules for both checked and hand luggage.
Check plug/voltage compatibility – Pack adaptors or converters for devices.
Create a packing inventory – Label boxes and keep a record for customs and insurance.
☐ Cancel UK utilities, broadband, TV licence, and council tax – Avoid being charged after you move.
Inform your local council of your move – Update electoral roll and council tax records.
Leave updated contact details with family and friends – Share your new number and address, plus a UK contact for urgent matters.
1–2 Months Before Departure
Use professional packing for fragile or bulky items – Protects valuables and eases the removal process.
Prepare customs documentation – Each country has different requirements; avoid delays at the border.
Choose between air freight and sea freight – Faster but pricier, or slower but cheaper.

<b>Arrange temporary storage</b> – Keep belongings secure if you're not moving everything at once.
Check removals insurance – Standard coverage is limited; declare valuables and consider additional protection.
<b>Opt for full-service delivery</b> – A removals company can handle packing, shipping, customs, and final delivery.
<b>Get health/travel insurance</b> – Covers medical care and emergencies not covered by NHS.
<b>Take prescriptions with you (plus doctor's letter)</b> – Ensures continuity of medication and smooth customs clearance.
Cancel or redirect subscriptions and memberships – Close gym, streaming, or phone contracts.
<b>Decide what to do with your vehicle</b> – Sell or ship, and update DVLA records.
Notify GP, dentist, and optician of your move – Prevents charges and keeps your records up to date.
Check if you need an International Driving Permit – Some countries require this in addition to your UK licence.

2–3 Weeks Before Departure
☐ <b>Set up Royal Mail redirection</b> – Prevent important post from being lost.
☐ <b>Finalise outstanding tasks</b> – Check utilities, taxes, and redirection services are all confirmed.
Confirm travel arrangements – Double-check flights, baggage, accommodation booking, and airport transfers.
Upon Arrival
Register with local authorities – May be required for residency, ID, or tax purposes.
Open a local bank account – Simplifies everyday expenses and salary payments.
☐ <b>Register with a healthcare provider</b> – Gain access to medical care quickly.
☐ <b>Explore transport options</b> – Convert your UK licence if required.
☐ <b>Learn basic local phrases and customs</b> – Helps with integration and daily tasks.
